### NEED GRAD WEEK ON-SITE ASSISTANCE?

Do not hesitate to reach-out to Grad Week Staff, we are here to help! If you have an issue or a situation during your trip, you must contact on-site staff so we can assist you while at the destination. Do not hesitate to call or text. If you cannot contact us yourself, have a friend call or text.

### NEED TO CALL HOME?

Upon arriving we strongly encourage that you take a minute and call home. We often get calls from parents saying they have not heard from their son or daughter. To avoid unnecessary calls and worrying, take few minutes and call or message your parent(s) to let them know you made it to the Bahamas safely. The easiest way to call home is to use the pay phones in the lobby. This will help you avoid costly hotel surcharges the hotel will charge when you call from your room. Simply dial the number listed on the pay-phone and a U.S. operator will place a collect call. Please note that calling to the U.S. from another country can be expensive and we recommend that you keep your call brief to avoid large phone charges. **\*Please Note:** If using your cell phone to call home, typical rates are \$2.00 per minute. Please keep calls brief! In addition, those with Data Plans, you can incur enormous cell phone bills by leaving your Data Connection on while in the Bahamas to avoid this we recommend keeping your phone in airplane mode.

### NEED MEDICAL ATTENTION?

Grad Week staff members are not doctors and thus will not make any judgment calls on whether whether medical attention is necessary for any reason. This decision is entirely up to the traveler and his or her parents. If you are in doubt as to whether medical attention is needed, we strongly recommend you contact your parent(s) and/or guardian(s) and ask for advice. If you need medical attention and it is a non-emergency, you can locate a Grad Week Staff member for directions to the nearest medical facility. If you cannot find a Grad Week Staff member, simply go to your hotel's front desk for assistance or call the number above. **If it is an emergency, dial 919 or 911 and have your friend notify a Grad Week Staff Member.**

### HELPFUL SAFETY & TRAVEL TIPS

- **Hydration – DRINK PLENTY OF WATER!!** – After many hours of travel, combined with lying in the sun and lack of sleep, it's critical that you stay hydrated. Be sure to drink lots of water during your trip. You'll feel better, be less susceptible to illness, and you have an overall better experience!
- **The Buddy System** – We highly recommend the buddy system. Please stay out in groups, especially when going back to your hotel at night. Always remember that there is safety in numbers! If you leave the hotel or an event, also tell a friend where you are going and when you plan to return.
- **Taxis** – Getting around is typically done by Taxi (Uber and Lyft do not operate in the Bahamas) so plan to have cash on hand for this and traveling in groups is the safest and most economical way to go. The taxis run all day and night. They will cost anywhere from \$4-\$7 per person depending on where you want to go. You can take up to 4 people in a standard taxicab. We strongly recommend that no one rides alone, especially at night!
- **Drugs & Alcohol** – Just say NO! DRUG POSSESSION AND USE IS ILLEGAL. Do not buy, sell, or use drugs anywhere. You will be kicked out of your hotel and will most likely end up in jail; all at your own expense.
- **Hotel/Room Damage** – You and your roommates are all responsible for paying for any and all damage to your room. This also includes any extensive cleaning due to stains, smoking, liquid spills etc. Take care of your room! Upon arriving to your room make sure you and your roommates take 5 minutes to check your room and report any damage to the room if any so that you are not charged for it when you check out. Please walk down to the Front Desk and report any damages immediately. Do not let strangers into your room. Keep your doors locked at all times, including any balcony sliding doors.

- **Hotel Safe Deposit Box** – We strongly recommend that you put all of your valuables in your safe deposit box upon check-in. THIS INCLUDES CELL PHONES, GO PROS, MONEY, ETC.!!! If a box is not provided to you in your room, you can get one at the front desk. **\*Report any missing/stolen items IMMEDIATELY to the HOTEL!** DO NOT leave your valuables out when you are not in the room; always put them away!
- **Checkout** – Airport buses leave on-time so don't be late or you can get left behind! The night before departure travelers will need to pack their bags and MUST clean up their room by picking up all trash (very important); garbage bags are available from the Grad Week Staff or the hotel Front Desk. On the day of your departure, proceed to the Front Desk to settle any incidental balances on your room. **You must be in the Lobby 3 hours prior to your scheduled flight departure time. \*Buses will leave without you!!** If your flight is not until late afternoon or evening, hotel checkout is at 11:00AM and you can check your bags at the bell desk. We suggest some last-minute shopping.
- **Motorized Water Sports** – We strongly recommend NOT renting mopeds, Jet-skis, or other motorized water sport equipment. Moped collisions are a common occurrence, and you are responsible for any damage. All equipment is owned locally and any damage to the equipment will be your responsibility. Be careful! Many students have been charged for damage they may not have done. Check the equipment for damage and **report it before using.**
- **Ocean** – The Ocean has a strong undertow! During the day, please check to see if your hotel has warning flags in front of the beach area. Most hotels will post these flags to let you know the current ocean conditions. Please do not go in the ocean at night regardless of the posted flags. It is extremely dangerous at night!
- **Balconies** – Do not sit on the ledge of your balcony or try and jump balconies from one room to another. Do not sit anything on the railing, it is very easy to fall off your balconies and can cause life threatening injuries!
- **Crossing the Street** – Be sure and look both ways to avoid being hit by moving vehicles. In the Bahamas, cars drive on the left side of the road not the right side of the street as in the US. This can be confusing for pedestrians. Looking both ways before crossing the street will ensure safety.
- **Mopeds** – We strongly recommend that you NOT rent mopeds. Mopeds are not allowed on the hotel property and cannot be parked in the parking garage. You are also responsible for damages.
- **Money Wire Services** – If you run out of money and need money sent from home, Grad Week has a service that is easy and will save you time. Simply call home and have your parents **email** our Corporate Office at (800) 448-4444 to request a Wire Transfer Form **or they can download it from the Grad Week website** (from the RESOURCES page at [www.gradweek.com](http://www.gradweek.com)). Our office will process their credit card for up to \$300 and **Grad Week will pay you on-site.** Please see a staff member for all money wire pick-ups. Money wires are distributed Monday-Friday at 7:00 PM (Bahamas time). You will need to bring photo ID to the Grad Week 24-hour room to receive your money.

### COVID SAFETY REMINDERS

CONGRATULATIONS Class of 2024! While COVID is slowly becoming a thing of the past, we still recommend exercising caution during your trip. We want you to have the best week of your life but more importantly, we want you to still be safe! Here's what you need to remember to have a happy and healthy grad trip:

- Wash your hands OFTEN, for at least 20 seconds! When soap and water aren't available, use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Masks are recommended and may be required in some establishments.
- Cover coughs and sneezes! If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow and immediately wash your hands.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth.
- If you have a fever, cough or difficulty breathing, seek medical attention and inform a Grad Week staff member IMMEDIATELY!
- Regularly clean hard surfaces. This means allowing housekeeping to clean your room DAILY!
- Drink only from your OWN cup. Do NOT share drinks!!
- Relax, be safe, and get ready for the best week of your life!

## OPTIONAL TOURS & ATTRACTIONS

Located in your hotel lobby, the Tour Desk has helpful representatives that will tell you all about the different optional tours & attractions that are available to you in Nassau. Here are a few popular ones:

- **Pirates of Nassau Museum:** Take a guided tour through a pirate's ship to explore the lifestyle and adventures of the plunderers of the Caribbean. Take your picture in the pirate shackles and afterwards visit the Pirates Pub.
- **Stuart Cove's:** Dive with sharks or snorkel over shipwrecks. See what's going on beneath the surface with the island's largest diving company. Bus pickup at the hotel.
- **Miniature Golf:** Practice your putting under the palm trees. Take a break from the pool for a round of mini golf. Located behind the Wyndham beside the Flamingo Grill.
- **Bahamas Fast Ferry:** once in a lifetime chance to walk on pink sandy beaches. Take the "Bohingy" for local fast ferry to Harbor Island for a day you'll never forget. Rent a golf cart on the quaint, charming island or just walk through the tiny town. A dawn to dusk adventure.
- **Dolphin Encounter:** Get up close and personal with the ocean's most intelligent inhabitant. Included is a boat ride to an island where you meet the trainers and the dolphins. Book on arrival, space is limited, and this one sell out fast!
- **Ardastra Garden and Zoo:** Visit this magical jungle garden, home to 100's of beautiful birds and animals including many of the endangered species of the Caribbean. Five and a half acres of twisted forest trails with fruit trees, waterfalls, and wildlife. A short walk off the #10 bus route
- **Island Sightseeing Tour:** Get to know Nassau. This bus tour will take you to local historic sites including the Queen's staircase, Fort Charlotte, and the Water Tower. Get at least 6 people together to see what most tourists miss.
- **Fishing Charter:** ake home a real fishing story. Spend an afternoon with just you and your friends on a chartered boat. Get a group of at least 5 together to go after the big one.
